

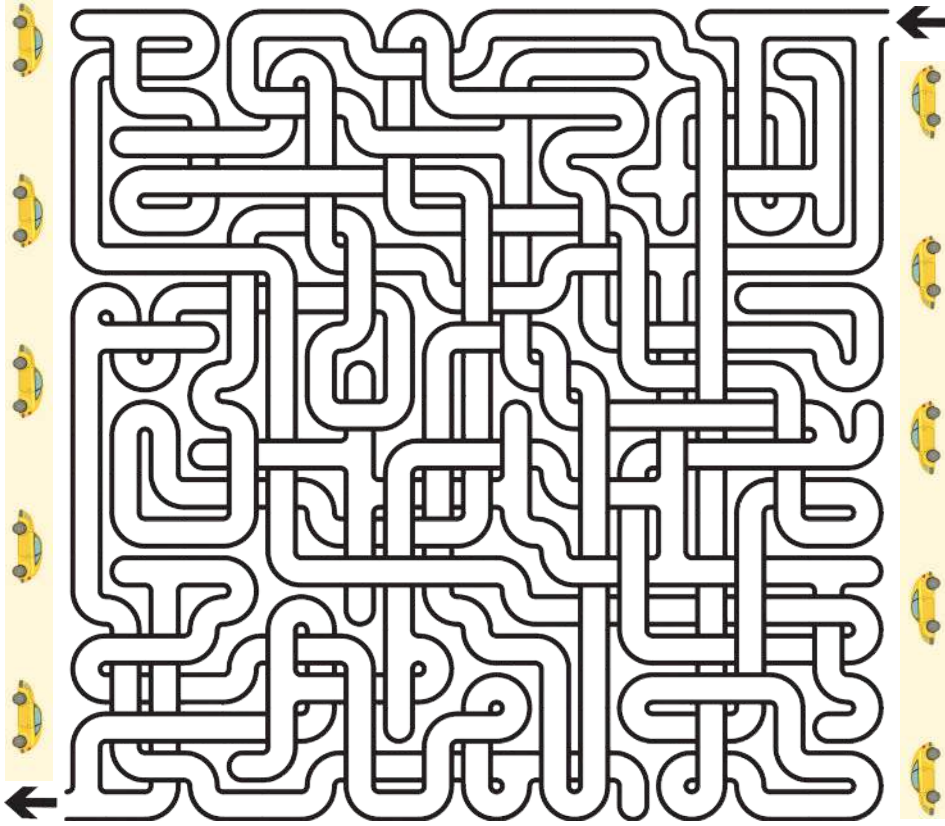
Glean-'zine*: Fun for all ages

For many people, summer days mean road trip days – even if you are not taking a grand adventure this summer, here are some activities you can do any time!

Under- and overpasses

If your road trip passes through an area with more traffic, you might see some under- and overpasses - here's a chance to practice navigating them, can you make it through?



Tuffy's Blueberry OATmeal Muffins

Tuffy says these are great for the morning nosebag, but they are also great for packing up for your next road trip!

Ingredients

- 1½ cups flour
- ½ cup sugar
- 1 Tbsp baking powder
- ½ tsp salt
- ¼ tsp nutmeg (freshly grated if possible)
- 1½ cups rolled OATS
- 1 cup milk
- 1 tsp vanilla extract
- 1 large egg
- ¼ cup unsalted butter, melted
- 1 heaping cup blueberries



Method

1. Preheat oven to 425 F.

2. Prepare 12 muffin cups.
3. Sift flour, sugar, baking powder, salt, and nutmeg together. Mix in OATS.
4. In a large bowl, stir together milk, vanilla, egg, and melted butter.
5. Add dry ingredients and mix just until thoroughly moistened. Don't overmix.
6. Fold in blueberries.
7. Fill prepared muffin cups two-thirds full.
8. Bake until golden and they spring back, 12 to 15 minutes.
9. Remove from oven and turn out on rack to cool for 5 minutes before serving.
10. Place in your nosebag and enjoy while doing macrame or painting protest signs.

Three games to pass the time

Whether or not you are in the car, these games are a fun way to keep your minds occupied.

21 Questions

The game: Guess what a person is thinking in 21 questions.

How to play:

- Someone thinks of something.
- The other people in the car begin asking questions in turn (examples: Is it a person? Animal, vegetable, or mineral?).
- Whoever guesses it right gets to start the next round – if 21 questions are asked without the

asker guessing what the askee is thinking, the askee starts the next round.

Fortunately/Unfortunately

The game: Making a fortunate situation out of an unfortunate situation.

How to play:

- One person starts by saying "Fortunately" and inventing something fortunate.

- The next person has to follow by saying something unfortunate about the previous situation.
- Move clockwise around the car switching between fortunate and unfortunate situations.
- If somebody can't think of something or they say the "Fortunately" instead of "Unfortunately," or vice versa, they are out.
- Last person standing wins.

The Alphabet Game

The game: Choose a category and take turns naming things from that category, working your way through the alphabet.

How to play: One person chooses the category (e.g. food) and everyone takes turns naming things (e.g. apple, brisket, chimichangas, donuts, etc.).
